Methodology

Boise State's Office of Research Compliance (ORC) worked with the Idaho Horse Council (IHC) to conduct a survey to gather information about equine in Idaho. Similar surveys had been conducted roughly every five years. Previous surveys were conducted by phone and mail while the current survey utilized an online survey platform to build and distribute the form and collect the associated data. The bulk of the survey remained the same aside from minor language corrections and the addition of a few questions.

ORC and IHC distributed the survey by directly emailing IHC distribution lists and contacts as well as posting and promoting a link to the survey through IHC's website and social media accounts. Survey distribution began on June 11, 2020 but was severely impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. Promotion was limited and restricted to online mechanisms due to restrictions and cancellations of equine-related events within the State. At the request of IHC, the survey remained open for an extended period of time to aid outreach. The survey closed June 30, 2021.

Estimation Using Registration Data

The survey distribution only focused on those who own equine. Registration data from breed associations coupled with survey response numbers were used to estimate the number of equine within the state and the associated economic impact. The breed specific organization registration data provided was limited to only the more popular breeds. The figure of 2% used to estimate numbers and valuations of equine was derived from a percentage based on the single most populous breed of equine registered in the state of Idaho, in relation to the number reported for the same equine breed in the survey responses. This percentage was used to extrapolate the numbers and valuations of all survey reported horses unless registry data was available.

The figure of 7% was used to extrapolate estimated numbers and valuations of all ponies, miniature horses, donkeys/burros, mules and other equine. Again, this percentage was derived using the breed specific organization registrations for the state in relation to the number reported by survey respondents.

No statistical analysis was conducted on the data collected.

Idaho Horse Council Survey - 2019
